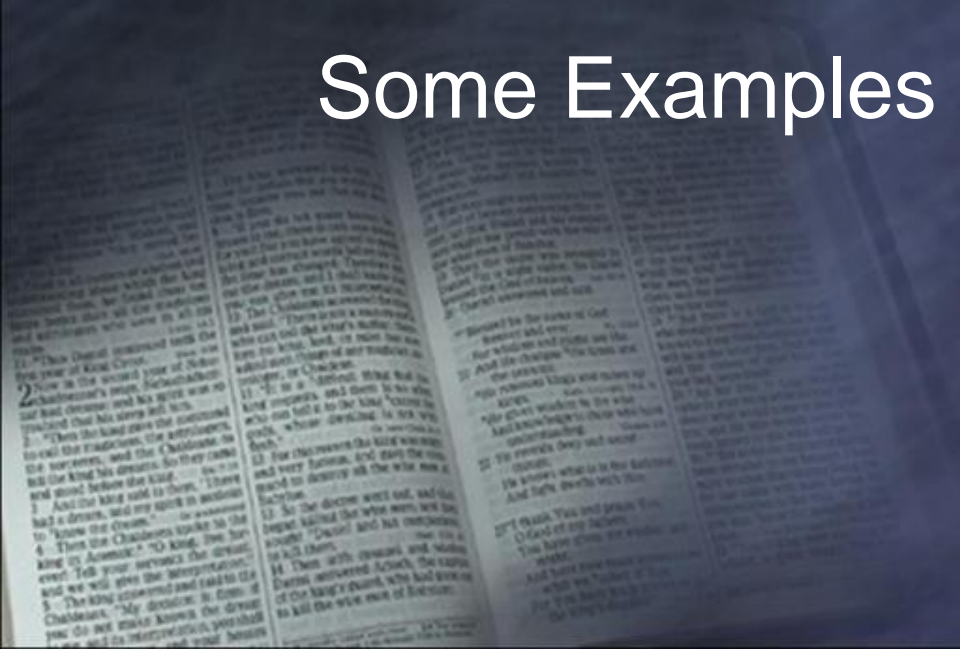

Question Writing

Some guidelines:

- Keep your questions 25 words or less long. Instructional components don't count towards your 25 words. (i.e. "Fill in the blank" or "Finish this verse", etc.)
- Keep your answer to 5 words or less. Preferably one word.
- Be sure to add context to your question.
- Focus on what you want your answer to be first and you will find it easier to create a question for it.

Question Writing

Q. Phinehas was one, what was the name of the other son of Eli?

A. Hophni

A. Phinehas

Question Writing

Q. How many sons did Eli the priest have?

A. **two**

Question Writing

Let's focus on a place

- And this man went up out of his city yearly to worship and to sacrifice unto the Lord of hosts in **Shiloh**. And the two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas the priest of the Lord, were there.

Q. What place was it that Elkanah went up to yearly to worship and to sacrifice unto the Lord of Hosts?

A. Shiloh

Question Writing

Let's focus on an object

- And she vowed a vow, and said, O lord of hosts, if thou wilt indeed look on the affliction of thine handmaid, and remember me, and not forget thine handmaid, but wilt give unto thine handmaid a man child, then I will give him unto the Lord all the days of his life, and there shall no **razor** come upon his head.

Q. What did Hannah vow to God in her prayer would not come upon the head of her man child?

A. **razor**

Question Writing-Bonus

Any Questions with more than one answer is a bonus.

- And this man went up out of his city yearly to worship and to sacrifice unto the Lord of hosts in Shiloh. And the two sons of Eli, **Hophni** and **Phinehas** the priest of the Lord, were there.

Bonus: 20 or either 10 Point

Q. Name the two sons of Eli the priest?"

A. Hophni and Phinehas

A. (certain of the) scribes

Q. Who said it and to whom was it said: "Son, thy sins be forgiven thee"

A. Jesus to the man sick of the palsy
